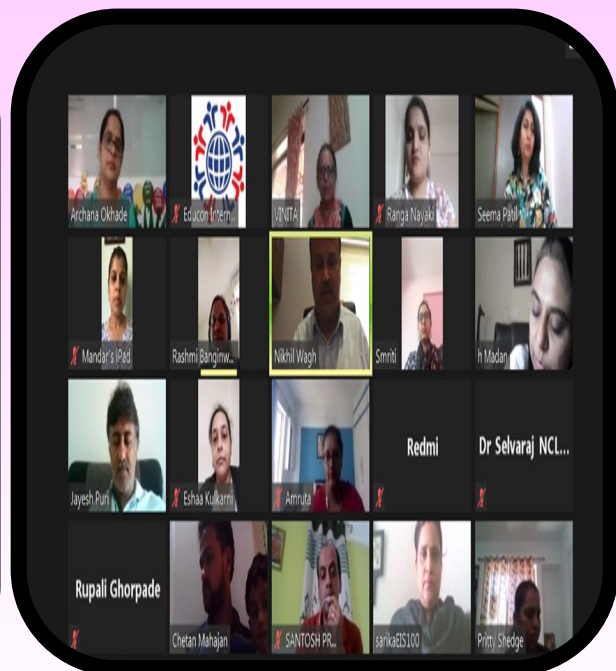

PTA Meeting

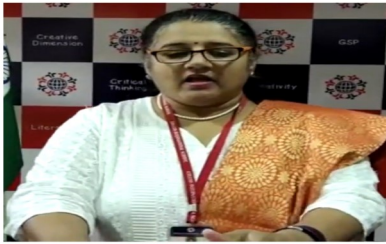
An Interactive Video Conference was organised with PTA to discuss and strategize the reopening of school for the Academic Year 2020-21.

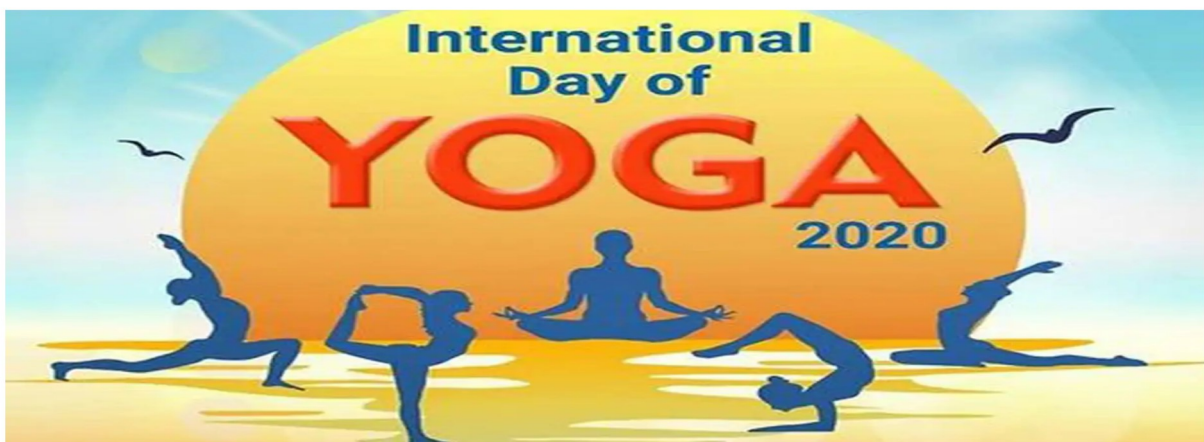

EIS is a part of ArtLink program since 3 years.

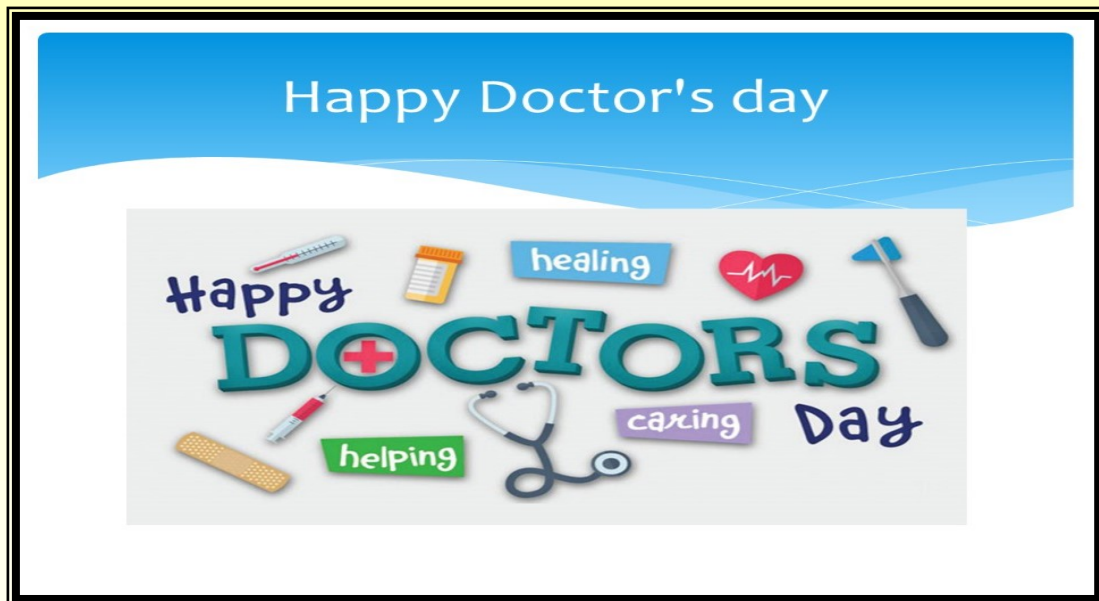
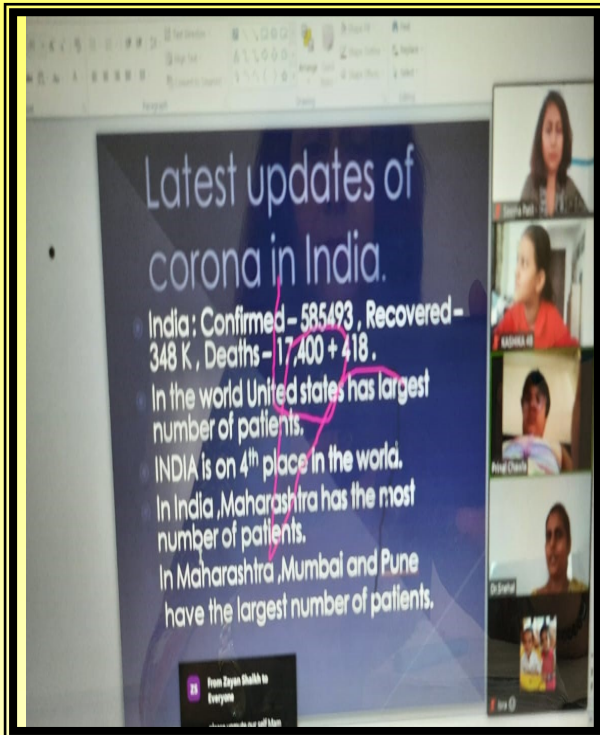

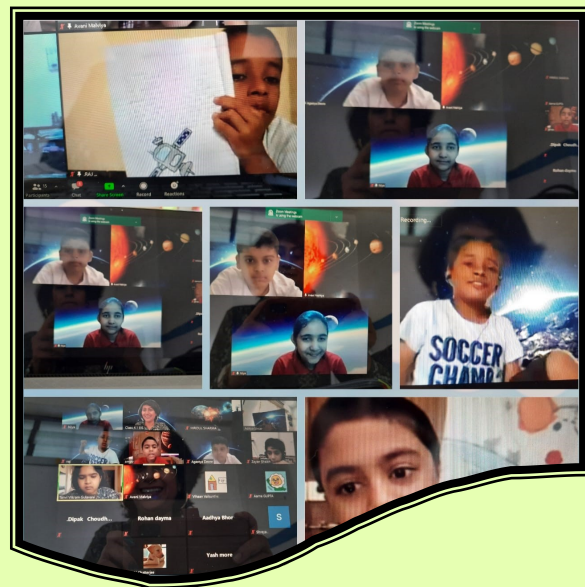
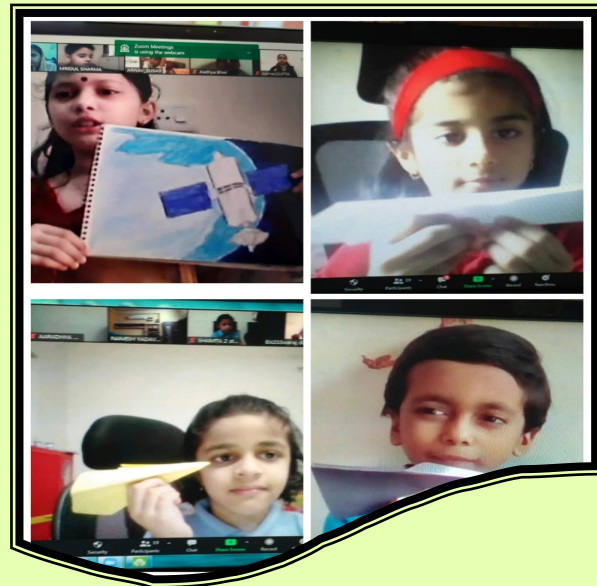
At EIS we believe in the inclusion of Experiential Learning - the process of learning through experience in the academic time table. Hands-on learning is also a form of experiential learning.

EIS Sports Week is a perfect time to get the whole school involved in sportingly fun days and raise the profile of sports with multiple sporting events taking place.



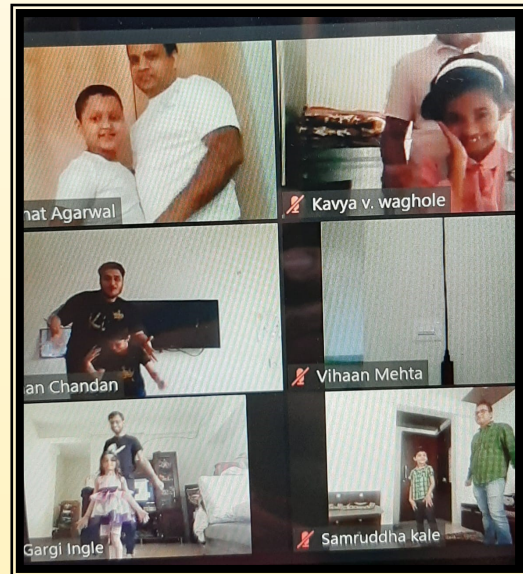
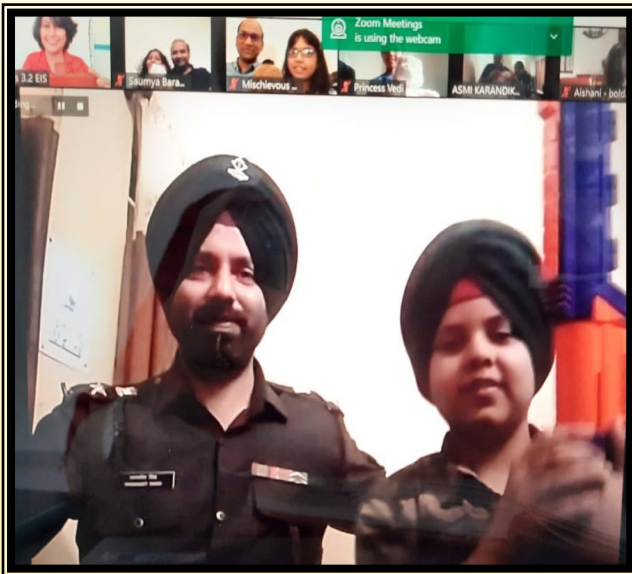
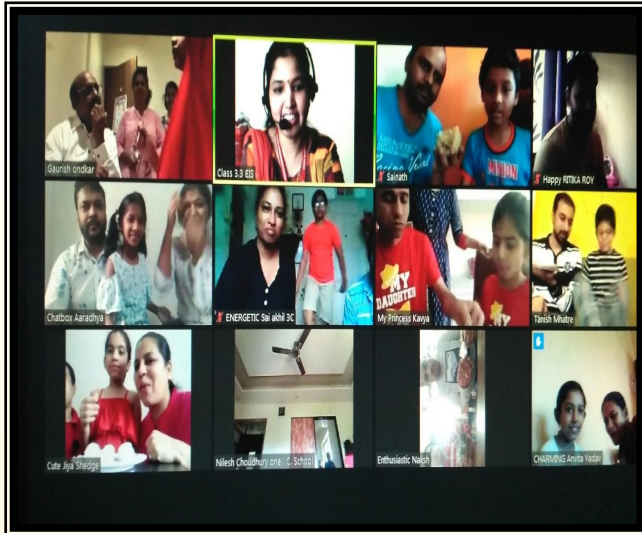

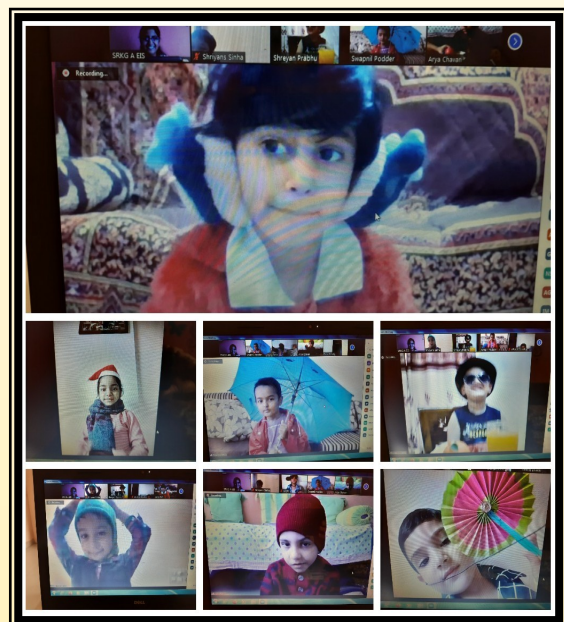
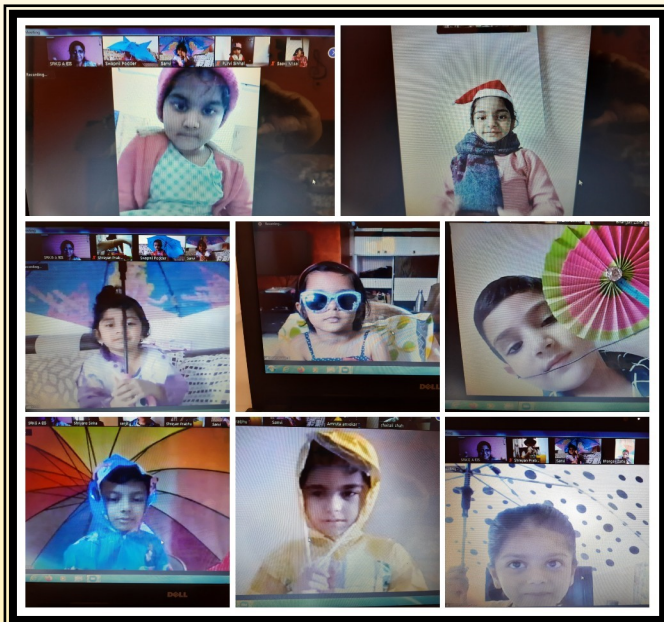
With great zeal and enthusiasm our preschoolers and primary students celebrated the Date With Dad event organized by EIS virtually this time during the lockdown period.

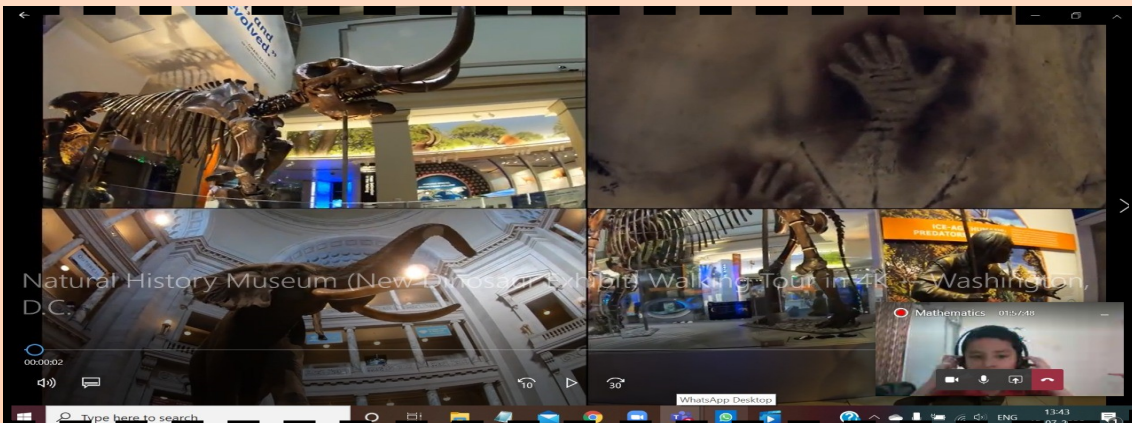
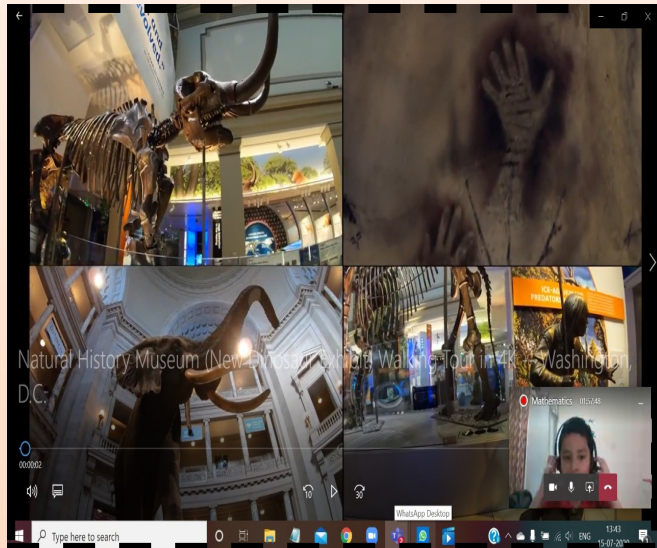
Virtual field trips instantly connects students with learning opportunities they may not get to experience otherwise. And it all happens from the comfort of the classroom.

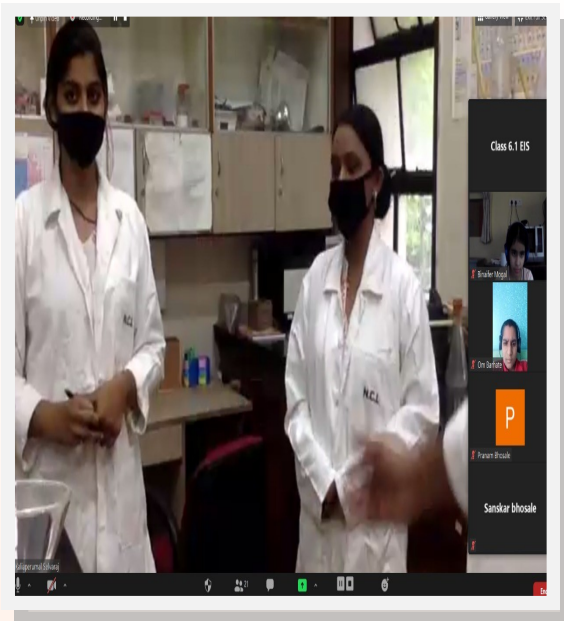

EIS students also visited NASA and Natural History Museum in USA.





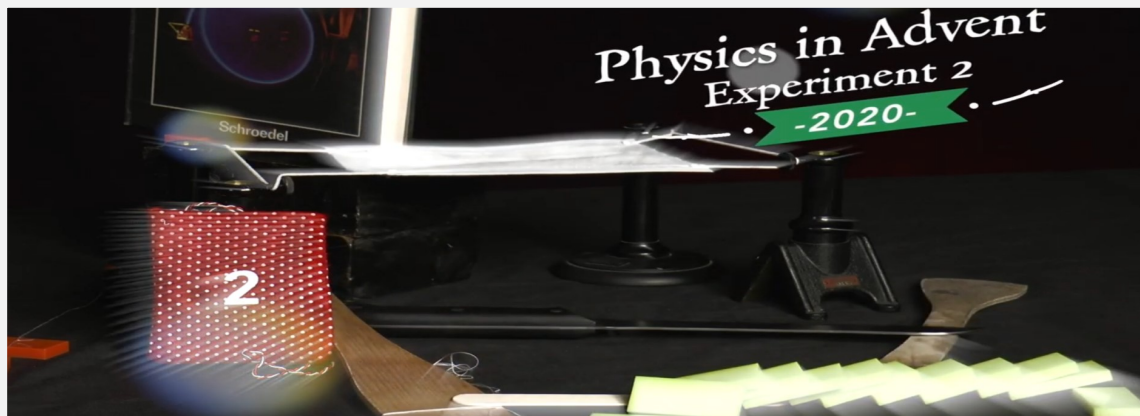
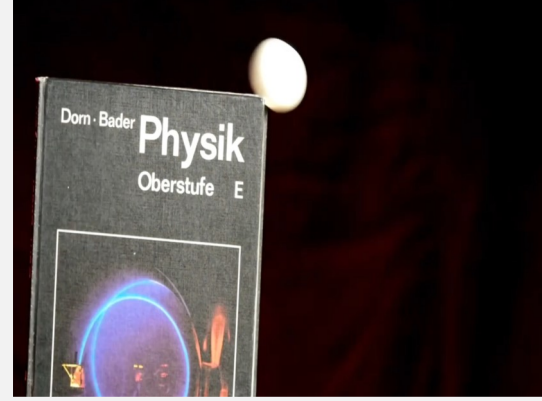
Virtual Field Trip to NCL

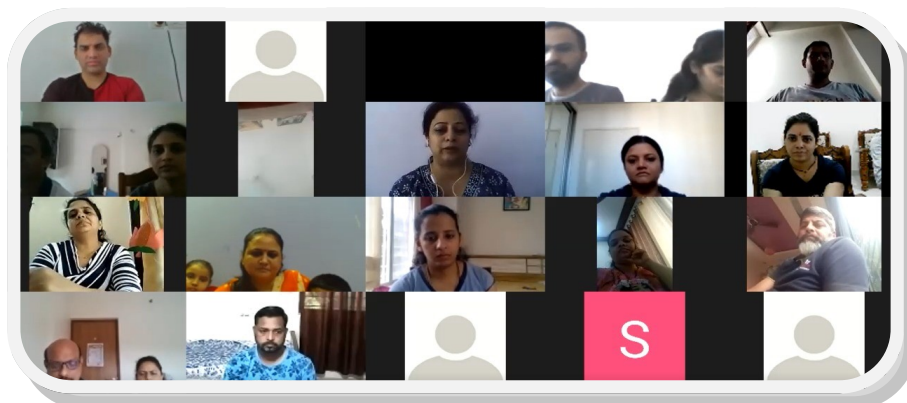

EIS had arranged a Parent Workshop/Interaction Session

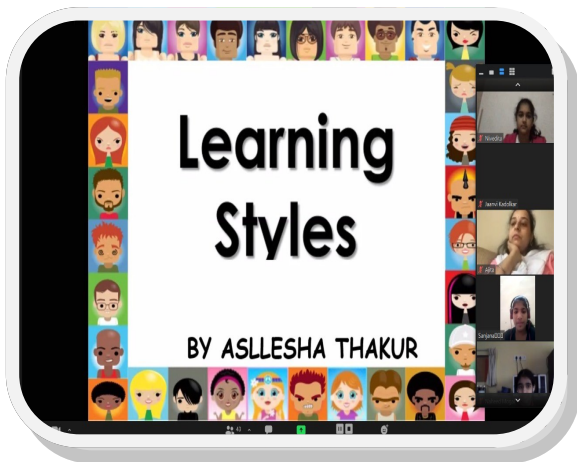
The Topic of interaction was " *Emotional well being during Pandemic* "

The interaction was extremely helpful and insightful to all of us.



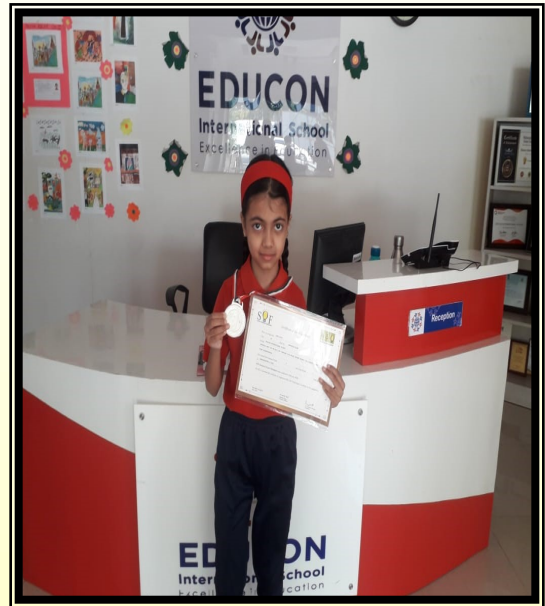

WHY PARENTS SHOULD READ TO THEIR CHILD

Reading to your child on a regular basis helps to build a stronger relationship with him. In his upbringing and development, the most important thing is to spend time with him. Reading to your child is an opportunity to set up a regular fun activity where you can spend time with him. Reading together can be used to share real life experiences. You can improve the bonding with your child by sharing your real-life experiences and the feeling of closeness and attention will encourage positive growth and development. Reading develops an early love for learning. In growing age of your child, you will not be stressed about getting him to read as reading becomes an enjoyable habit and he would become a lifetime reader.

We as parents should ensure the availability of books at home. Ask your child to choose a book from his very own collection. It shows that his opinion matters and you respect his opinions and decisions.

Let him hold the book and turn the pages himself. Make funny voices and let there be a modulation in your voice while you read. Ask him to look at the pictures and understand the situation and what would happen next, give him time to respond. This will help you understand how he imagines. Ask him what he understood from today's reading. This will help you understand the maturity of your child understands. It should be a fun activity along with learning's.



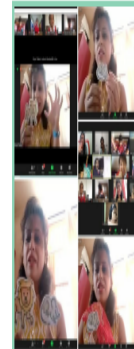

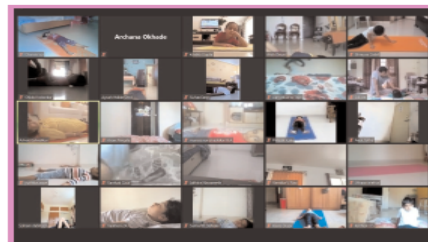
Yoga Day Celebrations

- Make assessment criteria more flexible with focus on the student-centric visual-auditory-kinesthetic (VAK) approach theory to identify students' preferred learning styles.
- Revamp teacher training programmes to effectively implement academic curriculums by leveraging technology to engage, motivate and involve students in digital online learning.

Future plans for EIS. Expanding our footprint countrywide by setting up centres of excellence aligned with our mission and vision and making necessary changes in education delivery to adapt to the new normal for providing holistic education.

A Children's Day with a difference

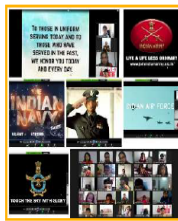
With soldiers, at Educon

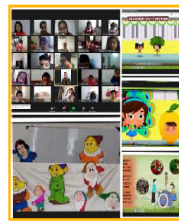
The corona pandemic lockdown could not stop EIS from celebrating like every year. They celebrated Children's Day virtually this year.
